EVENT DESCRIPTION

School groups from Troy to the New York Harbor are scientists for the day collecting data on river chemistry, fish and biology, salinity, temperature, turbidity, river sediments and more! Groups from elementary through AP High School and undergraduates join us in exploring their section of the Hudson River, and then sharing data through this estuary wide program. They tie their local sampling data to the rest of the river, creating a better understanding of the whole estuary.
