# **Site & Community Assessment**

\*Page 1 is to be completed during a field visit by the students, independently in or small groups. Page 2 focuses on community linkages - designed for small group work in class.

### **SITE ASSESSMENT QUESTIONS #1-5:**

- 1. List 5 descriptive words that you think best describe the appearance of your transit station. *Run down, colorless, separated from the area, PARKING LOT, no plants*
- 2. List 5 descriptive words that you think best describe the appearance of the area around the transit station.
  - Shopping, really big, cement-cement, large parking lot, indoor shopping only!
- 3. What challenges do you see in improving the transit station and redeveloping the area around it? (for example: expenses, competing business, clean up costs, traffic issues, etc.)
  - Getting people out of their cars and connect them to buses and trains need a campaign!
  - Reluctance of some to mix residential with commercial
  - Hard to get people to stop thinking about needing lots of parking!
  - Need to deal with flooding problems in the area
- 4. What community enhancing features (CEF) at this site should be added, retained or enhanced? Do any of them match the CEF you selected during our classroom activity? Which one/s? Remember to consider uses for the different periods of time: ES, HS, Senior
  - Large space mulituse center to serve different ages- possible center for children & seniors together
  - Recreation & park use as part of the facility with indoor and outdoor use
  - Include local business & farmers market
  - Add greenery in parking space for natural stormwater collection
  - Connect transit to merge train, buses, bikes and walkways
- 5. In planning, the support of others who live and work in the community is an important part of the process. Think about different groups and members of your community that might care about what happens to this space (for example sports teams, senior citizen groups, affordable housing groups, homes and businesses near the site).
