
Let's talk about Communities!






Community Planning Around Transportation



Site & Community Assessment *Page 1 is to be completed during a field visit by the students, independently in or small groups. Page 2 focuses on community linkages - we will do this in our second class visit.

Your focus is Transit Oriented Development (TOD), a planning design that builds around public transit in order to maximize access, encourage ridership, build connections to the community, through blending mixed-use residential and commercial areas. Start by reviewing the map of your community train station on the PLUS website (it can be printed if desired). http://www.ldeo.columbia.edu/plus/Rockland.html

The area you are considering for redevelopment is not just the train or bus station but the area around the station (see outline on map). Use the map, a visit to the site in your community, and this form to guide your investigation of the site. Consider the following to build linkages to the wider community: your community character; existing community resources; your selected 'community enhancing features'; and how to better connect and promote public transit.

PHOTO SITE ASSESSMENT ITEMS #1-4

Take one photo each of the following four items. Once you take the photos email them into <u>Rocklandplus@gmail.com</u>. Label each photo with your school, your last name and the number of the photo matching the # on the form. For example: Nanuet student Joseph Lee for item #1 which asks "how it feels to be waiting in this station" would tag image as **'Nanuet Lee 1.jpg'** and email it to us.

- 1. Photo 1: An image that provides a sense of how it feels to be waiting in this station.
- Photo 2: An image that shows what there is to do in the area if you had half an hour to wait Stores? Benches? Food places? Gym?
- 3. Photo 3: An image that shows the top one thing or space that you want to improve.
- 4. Photo 4: An image that captures the feature you like the best in this space.

STAKEHOLDER CONSIDERATIONS

5. The support of others who live and work in the community is an important part of the planning process. Think about different groups and members of your community that might care about what happens to this space (for example sports teams, school groups, senior citizen groups, affordable housing groups, homes and businesses near the site). We call these different people/groups 'stakeholders' in the planning process.

Who can you think of that should be considered when re-developing your site? Who are the stakeholders? Brainstorm a list with your class and consider if you should involve any of them in the planning & development of your proposed site.
