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## Goal and objectives

 Goal: Increased use of disaster risk information for risk management decision making

### Objectives:

- 1) A consolidated, updated, and improved global evidence base for disaster risk management
- 2) Greater access to evidence on global disaster risk levels and risk factors
- Increased capacity to analyze disaster risks in high risk countries

### Outputs and Inputs

#### Outputs:

- 1) A global disaster risk report containing results and interpretation
- 2) An on-line, queryable GIS data platform giving access to input data sets and results

#### Inputs:

- 1) Improved hazard, exposure and vulnerability data sets
- 2) An enhanced global disaster risk assessment methodology
- Chapters on specific high risk situations by local experts conforming to common theoretical and methodological standards

## Global risk update

- Characteristics (ref. January risk expert meeting)
  - an overall theme e.g. disasters and poverty, urban risks
  - 2) global hotspots update
  - 3) country benchmark index(es) e.g. DRI, Indicators of Disaster Risk Management in the Americas
  - 4) "focus on ..." case studies that have particular applications (ideally 1 and 4 would link; the first issue could focus on something general, e.g. mainstreaming or recovery)
