A Day in the Life of the Hudson River Fish ID

This sheet shows distinctive features of these similar looking fishes: spottail shiner, silversides, bay anchovy, young-of-the-year [YOY] herring/American shad, and - on the reverse side – three species of killifish.

Spottail Shiner (freshwater):



Dark spot at base of caudal fin

Silversides (fresh and saltwater species):



Two dorsal fins (front one often folded down, hard to see – look carefully)

Bright silver stripe along lateral line

Bay Anchovy (found throughout estuary):



Single dorsal fin


Elongated anal fin

Jaw extends past its eye


YOY Herring/American shad (mainly fresh and brackish water):



Belly has knife-like edge (not rounded)



Striped Killifish (salt and brackish water):



Male with dark vertical stripes on head and body



Female with dark horizontal lines

Tail fin of both sexes has more angular corners


Banded Killifish (fresh and brackish water):



14-20 vertical stripes (dark on female; silvery on male)

Tail fin has slightly rounded corners

Mummichog (found throughout estuary):



10-18 vertical stripes (dark on female; silvery on male)

Tail fin has rounded corners


"Plump" – body deep in relation to its length



Day In the Life of the Hudson Fish ID

This sheet shows distinctive features of these similar looking fishes: young-of-the-year [YOY] striped bass and white perch, and - on the reverse side – largemouth bass, smallmouth bass and yellow perch.

White Perch (found throughout estuary):



Lacks stripes and has two slightly joined dorsal fins

Back more humped

Striped Bass (found throughout estuary):

Two separate dorsal fins



Dark stripes running head to tail (often hard to see on YOY)

Back less humped

Largemouth Bass (freshwater):



Green in color with a dark horizontal band from head to tail

Jaw extends to rear of the eye


Smallmouth Bass (freshwater):



Brownish or bronze with vertical bars along its body

Jaw extends to midpoint of the eye

Yellow Perch (freshwater):



Yellow sides marked with vertical olive green bars

Reddish orange pelvic fins
