➤ Marine strays are marine species that end up in brackish or freshwater areas where they normally wouldn't be found due to various reasons such as being swept by the current or warming water expanding their range.

➤ Invasive species are not native to an ecosystem. Outcompeting native species their population grows "aggressively" causing environmental or economic harm.
